ACCOMMODATIONS: Price is based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms/cabins are often smaller than doubles. 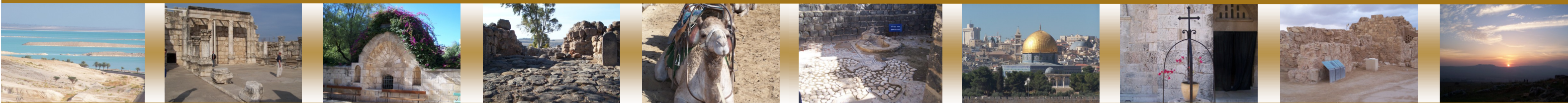

Day 1 MON, MAR 12: DEPART USA

We are on our way from our various embarkation points to the land of Israel and a journey through the pages of the Bible. Enjoy the in-flight meals and entertainment, and rest at the beginning of the flight in order to take full advantage of our arrival time.

Day 2 TUE, MAR 13: ARRIVE TEL AVIV, VALLEY OF ELAH, BEER SHEVA

We arrive at Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion airport in the afternoon. The tour company will have a personal representative to meet us, help us get our luggage, and make our way through customs to where we will meet our expert guide and driver. Israeli guides are legendary for their knowledge and dedication. Ours will escort us throughout our tour for these next ten days, and be an invaluable help in gaining a deeper understanding of Israel's history, archeology, culture, and modern life. We will proceed south to begin in the wilderness regions. Our first stop will be in the valley of Elah, where David faced the giant Goliath and our overnight will be in Beer Sheva, the traditional southernmost point in ancient Israel, where Abraham and Isaac both dug wells and worshiped, Hagar wandered with Ishmael, and Jacob fled from Esau. Our journey into the Scriptures has begun! Dinner and overnight in Beer Sheva.

Day 3 WED, MAR 14: BEER SHEVA, DEAD SEA

This is a day of exploration of Israel's southern, desert regions. We visit the Negev, where Moses led the children of Israel after their failure at Kadesh Barnea. We'll see the wilderness of Zin, and see the settlement and burial site of David Ben Gurion—modern Israel's first prime minister, who wanted to see this desert bloom. We'll make our way through various places in the wilderness toward the Dead Sea. Along the way we will experience Bedouin hospitality similar to that of Abraham's day. The desert was a training ground for the patriarchs and for Israel, and we'll consider how the exodus and wilderness experiences foreshadowed the life and work of Jesus. Days end will put us at Ein Bokek, a resort area along the Dead Sea, where you can finish your day with a float on the water. Dinner and overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 4 THU, MAR 15: DEAD SEA, MASADA, EN GEDI, QUMRAN, GALILEE

Heading forward in history today, we begin with Masada, Herod the Great's impressive mountain fortress where Jewish zealots made their last stand against their Roman conquerors in AD 73. Back to the Old Testament, we visit the oasis and springs of En Gedi, David's hiding place from Saul, and then onward. Then we head to Qumran, where Old Testament manuscripts dating to the 2nd century were part of the famous Dead Sea Scrolls discovery. We'll see the caves where these scrolls were hidden by the Essenes for

nearly 2,000 years. We'll then pass by Jericho (stopping if conditions permit) and travel up the Jordan Valley to Beit Shean, a city dating back to the Canaanites but now known for its remarkable restored ruins from the days of the Decapolis in the Gospels. Our "long" day (both in terms of sightseeing and the length of the country) ends on the shores of Tiberias, where we have dinner and spend the night.

Day 5 FRI, MAR 16: GALILEE

"Galilee" of the Gentiles will come alive today, as we head north to Tel Dan, the northernmost point in ancient Israel—one of the two places where Jeroboam erected a calf for the northern tribes to worship. From this ancient city we'll make our way to Caesarea Philippi, a site of idol worship from Baal in the OT to the Greek god Pan during the NT times, and the place of Peter's great confession of Christ. We'll explore the Golan Heights, and have lunch in a Druze village, afterwards we make our way to Sachne for Baptism (for those interested), before returning to the shores of Galilee, for possible further exploration! Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 6 SAT, MAR 17: GALILEE

We continue to explore the Galilee. We'll see a boat from Jesus' day and take a ride on the Sea of Galilee. Capernaum, the Mount of Beatitudes, the site of the multiplication of loaves and fish, Bethsaida—they all bear witness to the ministry of Jesus. We'll have St. Peter's fish for lunch, and then head toward Nazareth, where we can see a re-creation of the village from the first century. We'll also visit Zippori, the major cultural center near Nazareth, and explore the possible links between this place and Jesus' early years. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Day 7 SUN, MAR 18: MEGIDDO, CAESAREA MARITIMA, JERUSALEM

We head to the center of the Holy Land today, beginning with our trip to Megiddo, site of the fortified city of Solomon and Ahab and overlooking the Plain of Jezreel—Armageddon. We will then go to the Monastery of St. George, near the place where Elijah would confront the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel. We then travel to the coast, where we visit Caesarea Maritima. This was the Roman capital and port for the province, and both Herod and Pilate lived here. It is also the place where the gospel came to the Roman centurion, Cornelius, opening the door of faith to Gentiles everywhere. We'll explore the ruins of Herod's day, a Crusader fortress, and see an aqueduct that brought water to the city. We then make our way to the true heart of the land—Jerusalem. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem

Day 8 & 9 MON & TUE, MAR 19 & 20 JERUSALEM & BETHLEHEM

Jerusalem beckons and we will answer! Our activities will be governed by the times of availability of these sites, but we will experience this city fully. We'll visit the Mt. of Olives, upon which Jesus taught of the coming judgments, from which Jesus ascended, and where he will return to earth! We'll make our way down the Palm Sunday Road, stopping in the Garden of Gethsemane. We'll visit the Southern steps of the Temple, and we'll walk the traditional Via Dolorosa through the Old City, seeing the Stone Pavement under the Sisters of Zion Convent. From here we will visit to the Western Wall—Judaism's holiest site; and to Temple Mount (conditions permitting). Of great interest will be the Church of St. Peter Gallicantu—built over the site of the High Priest's home where Jesus was tried, and where Peter denied the Lord. We'll walk the streets and shop in the Old City, visiting trusted vendors for souvenirs. We'll make a trip to the City of David, seeing the excavations of David's palace and much more, offering the chance to go through Hezekiah's Tunnel—an ingenious water delivery system to the pool of Siloam—bring water shoes and be ready to get wet if you go. One evening we'll walk through the Western Wall Tunnel and see the very foundations of that structure.

We will visit Bethlehem, where we'll see the Church of the Nativity, and the Shepherd Fields. A visit to Bethlehem is completed by a stop at an olivewood store, and we'll stop at what we believe is the best. If you are still ready to explore after dinner, why not enjoy a short walk to Ben Yehuda Street and some of the other joys of the city. Dinners and overnights in Jerusalem.

Day 10 WED, MAR 21: JERUSALEM

Our last day in Jerusalem. We'll take a morning trip to see a scale model of the city from Jesus' time, and the Shrine of the Book, where parts of the Dead Sea Scrolls are displayed. We'll then go to Yad Vashem, the Israeli memorial for victims of the Holocaust. We'll return to our hotel for lunch and some free time, and then make our last stop—a trip to the Garden Tomb, where we will reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus through a time of communion. From here, we'll leave for a farewell dinner, and those ending their trip will travel on to Ben Gurion Airport and the late night flight home. Those doing our extension will return to the hotel in Jerusalem.

Day 11 THU, MAR 22: ARRIVE BACK TO USA

As we travel home, we'll reflect on what we've seen and marvel at how much we have grown in our understanding of our faith. Arrival in the U.S. will be in the morning, with transfers to various final destinations.

DAY 11 - THU, MAR 22: JERUSALEM, ALLENBY BRIDGE - JORDAN, MT. NEBO, MADABA, PETRA

This morning we depart Israel for Jordan via the Allenby Bridge, where we will be met by our agent and assisted through security and customs. We board our motorcoach and travel to Mt. Nebo to stand where Moses stood and viewed the Holy Land. In front of the church you can take in a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the roof tops of Jerusalem.

We continue to Madaba, the moabite town of Madaba of the Bible. Next travel to Machaerus (Mukawir). Perched on a 700 meter high hill about 50 km southwest of Madaba are the ruins of Herod the Great's fortress. Machaerus, where John the Baptist was beheaded by his successor Herod Antipas. Late in the afternoon we continue South for the "Rose red city of Petra". Dinner and overnight in Petra.

DAY 12 - FRI, MAR 23: PETRA, AMMAN

After breakfast, we visit the site of Petra, a 2000 year old Nabatean city. We'll walk a short half-mile through the narrow passage-way with cliffs on either side (called the "Siq"). At the end of the Siq in the towering brightness appears Petra's most impressive monument, the Treasury, a massive royal tomb that was carved out of the solid rock from the mountain. If time is permitted, we will see Jabal Harun - the place where Aaron is buried. We return to town and leave for in the afternoon for Amman. Dinner and overnight in Amman.

DAY 13 - SAT, MAR 24: AMMAN, JERASH, ALLENBY BRIDGE, TEL AVIV

This morning we travel to Jerash. Near Jerash the road crosses the river Zerqa, the biblical Jabbock. Near the Jabbock River, Jacob wrestled with God. We will tour Jerash. This city is one of the world's best preserved examples of Roman provincial city. It is thought to have had a population of 20,000 people and was one of the wealthiest cities of the Roman empire.

After our lunch stop, we travel to the Allenby Bridge for Israel. After border formalities, our agent meets and assists us through customs and security. We transfer to Jaffa and then stop in time for dinner, before being transferred to Ben Gurion Airport for our late evening flight home.

DAY 14 - SUN, MAR 25: ARRIVE U.S.A.

We arrive home same day.
